

What's going on with the Senior Center? A Glimmer of Hope...

We're here with a follow-up on the ongoing status of our Senior Center. While the future remains uncertain, there's a glimmer of hope in sight as we navigate the year ahead. Weber Human Services (WHS) and Weber County are currently deliberating the future of Senior Center services and which centers will continue operating. In a positive move, both entities have decided not to close any centers until July 2025.

Recently, we received correspondence from WHS and Weber County outlining a potential restructuring, suggesting a possible reduction in the number of Senior Centers from four to three, with the new addition of Riverdale Senior Center as a funded facility.

Given the possibility of our center being one of the chosen three to remain open, Washington Terrace City is diligently preparing a response to the Request for Proposal (RFP) we've received, aimed at continuing senior services in our center. We're eager to collaborate with Weber County and WHS for the foreseeable future, pledging ongoing support for the programs offered by both entities. It's important to emphasize that our doors are open to seniors from across the county, reflecting our commitment to this county-wide initiative.

The WHS dedicated staff members, who tirelessly serve individuals from all corners of the county, deserve recognition for their exceptional efforts. We deeply appreciate their contributions to our community. Together, we strive to provide a welcoming environment and top-notch services to seniors throughout the region.

It's worth noting that the funding for Weber Human Services comes from Federal, State and County resources, emphasizing the broad-based support for this county-wide service. The partnership between Washington Terrace City, Weber County, and WHS has been steadfast for decades, predating even the construction of our new Senior Center in 2009. With the construction of the Senior Center, the City increased its commitment to senior services, with WHS spearheading the programming. We are hopeful the partnership will continue for years to come.

In essence, our collaboration is founded on mutual dedication and shared goals. As we look ahead, we eagerly anticipate continuing this partnership to ensure that all seniors in the County receive the care and support they deserve for years to come.

CONSTRUCTION CORNER

The 300 West Road Reconstruction Project is scheduled to be replaced starting June 10, 2024, and is anticipated to be completed by October 1, 2024. The impacted area of the project will go from 5000 South to the Riverdale border (approx. 4400 S). As 300 West is a main corridor through Washington Terrace, reconstruction will ensure longevity, safety and reduce future repair costs.



The scope of the project will include removing and replacing the asphalt road section, replacing curb and gutter, replacing various sections of sidewalk and eliminating trip hazards. Reconstruction of 300 West is a major project that will require traffic detours and road closures during construction.

FIREWORKS SAFETY GUIDELINES:

As we embark on another summer filled with celebrations, let's prioritize safety. Understanding the legal dates, permissible fireworks, and safety guidelines within Washington Terrace City can ensure a fantastic and incident-free fireworks season.

Legal Dates:

July 2-5: In celebration of Independence Day

July 22-25: For Pioneer Day

December 31: New Year's Eve (If New Year's Eve is on a Sunday, then fireworks are permitted on the following day, January 1)



On the mentioned dates, fireworks can be discharged between the hours of **11:00 AM** and **11:00 PM**. However, on **July 4** and **July 24**, the time extends until **midnight**. On **December 31**, the permissible hours are from **11:00 AM** until **1:00 AM** the following day, **January 1, 2025**.

Please remember that anyone using fireworks outside these designated times may violate City and State regulations and could face penalties.

Restricted Fireworks:

While many fireworks are legal to use, it's crucial to be aware of the prohibited items within Washington Terrace City. The following fireworks are NOT allowed for use by the general public:

- Firecrackers
- Bottle rockets
- Roman candles
- Rockets
- Aerial salutes

Fireworks Safety Guidelines:

In the interest of public safety, we urge everyone to follow these essential guidelines:

- Always follow the instructions provided by the firework manufacturer.
- Never allow children to handle or ignite fireworks.
- Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of a fire or other mishap.
- Light fireworks one at a time, then move away quickly.
- Never try to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks.
